

Welcome to Revelation United Methodist Church!

There are exciting developments happening with our United Methodist neighbors in the Wausau area. In addition to First UMC and Wesley UMC, there has been a small congregation in Rothschild called Highland UMC, started several decades ago with the help of our church. Highland has been small but mighty, with faithful leaders and many certified lay servants. They saw an opportunity to invest in starting a new church by giving their building and assets to help a younger generation of United Methodist leaders launch a new congregation. Hmong United Methodists, who have been worshiping at Wesley UMC for decades, as well as at First UMC for several years, felt led to start a new church in a location of their own to reach the wider Hmong community. With deep bonds and appreciation at Wesley UMC, they had a sending service on November 7, 2021, to bless the beginning of a new Hmong congregation. Since then, there have been an average of 45 people attending Bible Studies, prayer, and praising God on Sunday mornings at the Rothschild church. In addition to discerning their new name, Revelation UMC, they are working on developing a clear vision, mission, leadership structure, and discipleship plan. They sense a call to reveal Christ (a "revelation" of God) to the broader Hmong community in our area. Bishop Jung and the District Superintendents are working on confirming and preparing a Hmong Church Planter to pastor the congregation, likely as a 1/2 time appointment. Please keep our brothers and sisters at Revelation UMC in your prayers as they begin this new ministry and mission in the Wausau area.



Project Connect Event

On the morning of Wednesday, April 27 our church will host Project Connect, a program designed to bring the homeless and near homeless together with the service providers who can help them with food, shelter, job opportunities and access to healthcare.

Twelve service providers including The United Way, Bridge Community Clinic, The Presbyterian Free Clinic, Job Service and The Neighbor's Place will provide information filled tables and knowledgeable people to help those attending find available services of which they may not have been aware.

In addition to the opportunity for the guests to find needed help, the service providers have the opportunity to meet and exchange ideas on how they can best serve the folks in need of secure shelter and a brighter future.

About 50 breakfasts consisting of French Toast, Sausage, Juice, and Coffee will be served by an excellent cooking, serving, and cleaning crew of very talented members of our congregation.

Hosting Project Connect provides another great way for FUMC Wausau to serve our community and to *Live and Share God's Love*.

Inviting Others to be a Part

"Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened." Matthew 7:7

In his book Creating Generous Congregations, David Heetland tells a story about an 8-year-old girl who often gave more than a tithe from her nickel and dime allowance. She once gave her grandmother 38 cents in small coins "for missions." Her grandmother then asked her, "Do you want this to go for homeless people, hospitals in Africa, or buying fish to stock ponds to feed the hungry?"

Her granddaughter replied, "Just a minute," and returned shortly with 29 cents more, making a total of 67 cents to be divided three ways. She found each mission so important that her initial gift was instantly almost doubled so she could support all three.

Too often, we worry that when we ask someone to support a ministry with either their time or their money, the request will be taken as pushy (at best) or offensive (at worst). And there are certainly people who would take it that way.

On the other hand, I believe that not inviting people to support a ministry I'm excited about excludes them from being a part of something that may be transformational for them, and the people touched by the ministry.

Finally, there are many people who are just waiting to be asked to be a part of something bigger than them. They may not be the first to raise their hands when a general invitation goes out but would love to be personally invited to be a part of what God is doing through the church.

I am anticipating the day when God's love finally triumphs and Jesus returns.


Eagle Scout Project
