From the Pastor

by Pastor Rebecca Voss Dear First Wausau Family of Faith,

Christmastime is full of wonderful memories, but sometimes it can become depressing when we miss loved ones and see empty seats. Many of us remember when pews were packed, and extra services were added to accommodate the "Christmas" crowds. Will we ever return to those days? Perhaps, but it helps to know some statistics that can lead us to pray with more insight.

In the past 30 years, the number of people in the U.S. who identify as agnostic, atheist, or non-religious grew from 8% to 29%. Christians now make up 63% of the populations (down from 90%), and people of other faiths rose slightly from 5% to 7%. Let's pray for all who claim to be Christians to live as gracious witnesses of God's love, not as judgmental people who drive people away from wanting to know Jesus.

Today, the average senior (or only) pastor is 60 years old, and 36% of church members are 65 and older. Both numbers have been rising a year and percentage each year.² Let's pray for more and younger people to be encouraged to explore a calling to pastoral ministry, and for God to lead the next generation of pastors to reach their peers.

Here is a helpful summary of the different generations that will be mentioned more below. Those born between 1928-45 are often called the "Silent Generation", and for some ironic reason they are not heard in the statistical research I found. Baby boomers were born between 1946 and 1964. They're currently between 57-75 years old (71.6 million in the U.S.). Gen X was born between 1965 and 1979/80 and is currently between 41-56 years old (65.2 million people in the U.S.). Gen Y, or Millennials, were born between 1981 and 1994/6. They are currently between 25 and 40 years old (72.1 million in the U.S.) ³Gen Z are those born between the late 1990's and early 2010's. Let us pray for the Holy Spirit to move in all generations of people in ways they can each connect to Christ.

In 2000, the average attendance in U.S. churches was 135 people. In 2020, it was 65. In 2023, in-person attendance averaged 60, but another 15 attended online, to add up to 75 in average worship attendance. "Baby Boomers" have had a sharp decrease in attendance since Covid. Before the pandemic in 2020, 31% of the Boomer generation attended church, but by the end of 2022, only 22% were attending. In contrast, the Millennial generation outpaced all the other generations in attendance. Before the pandemic, 26% of white, and 31%

of non-white millennials attended church. Now, 30% of white and 40% of non-white millennials attend worship.⁴ Let's pray for our church to be truly welcoming to younger and more diverse people.

There are interesting differences in attendance frequency between mainline Protestants (like us), evangelical Protestants, and Catholics. 33% of Mainline Protestants attend weekly, 43% attend less regularly, and 24% attend rarely if ever. Catholics are a bit more faithful in worship, with 39% attending weekly, 40% less regularly, and 20% rarely to never. Evangelical Protestants are the most devoted in attendance, with 58% weekly attendance, 30% monthly-ish, and 12% rarely/never. Interestingly, those who worship weekly are 80% likely to experience spiritual peace and well-being, compared to 52% of those who attend less frequently and 41% of those who attend rarely if ever. 5 These attendance numbers include both inperson and online. 10% of attenders only attend online, and another 16% attend partially online and partially in person. For black Protestants, those online statistics double.⁶ Let's pray for more people to find weekly worship, whether in person or online, to become a priority in their faith and life.

We light a candle each week of Advent to pray for the hope, love, joy, and peace we expectantly wait for in Christ. May Christ be born in us, so that we and the world may more fully know the hope, love, joy, and peace of God.
