From the Pastor

Dear Wausau First UMC Family of Faith,

On Sunday, February 19, you made a historic and transformational vote! Your ballots unanimously affirmed, 63 to 0, to adopt a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that was previously sent to all members in the mail. You made the decision that *being* a church is more important than managing a church building. You decided that the founders of our congregation and all who formed our faith would be pleased in how the legacy of First UMC can continue to be deepened for future generations in broader ways in Wausau. You have set a precedent that will likely be used as a model for congregations in Wisconsin and beyond, by Methodists and more.

Though we are grateful for "bricks and mortar" (or in our case, concrete and terrazzo), this vote allows us to concentrate more on ministry and mission. Our finances can focus on providing more meaningful worship, faith formation, and outreach. Our time can be more devoted to building better relationships with God, each other, and our community, instead of fixing an aging building. The question we need to ask ourselves now is whether we are equally committed to building up the church – Christ's Body – as we have been in working on constructing and caring for our building over the past 60-some years.

Having Lent begin three days after this vote, I invite us to take these forty days to pray and deepen our understanding and commitment to building stronger relationships with Christ and one another. Some of this may happen as we go through our building's treasures from the past together and figure out if, how, or where they should be used in the present. As we work through logistics like this, God is also helping us to rethink what "church" is. When we process and pray together, we will sense the Holy Spirit encouraging us to trust Christ more deeply, reminding us that we are entrusted as stewards not primarily of property, but of the well-being of all people who God deeply loves.

Note from Trustees and Finance Committee

Organ Repairs and Improvements

We have all enjoyed our wonderful church organ. It is a top-of-the-line instrument. It does require significant upkeep and repair at times. We recently incurred a cost of over \$55,000 to repair the organ by replacing failing leather stops with longer-lasting digital stops. If anyone would like to make a special donation to help us pay for that expense, please send in payment and mark that it is for organ care donation. We greatly appreciate help in funding this large expense for a great instrument that helps us worship in meaningful ways. If you have any questions about the organ or options for donations, please contact Martie Pahris in the church office.

Sanctuary Lighting Update

Similar to our organ, we will be incurring significant expenses for updating our Sanctuary suspended lights. We are grateful to find an electrical contractor (K & M) with successful experience in replacing the wiring and transitioning our custom sanctuary fixtures to better and brighter LED lighting along with other lighting repairs. This will cost about \$20,000.

Soap

UWF has been making detergent for the PNC for many years. If guests choose to take a jug of this detergent, it does not count as one of the chosen items. Many of you have been donating gallon jugs for this mission and we Thank You! However, we now have plenty of jugs and you do not need to bring any for the time being. Here is the simple recipe. Many of our members use this and it is safe for HD washers.

HOMEMADE DETERGENT

3 TBLS Borax
3 TBLS washing soda
2 TBLS Dawn dishwashing liquid
Put the ingredients into a gallon jug
Add 2 cups boiling water to the jug
Swish until everything is dissolved
Slowly add more water to make 1 gallon
use ½ cup per load
